PEDRR SHOUTOUT: 2nd Preparatory Committee Meeting held in Geneva; endorsement of ecosystem-based approaches from Member States

Held on 17-18 November, the 2nd PrepCom for the World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction was held with close to 1,000 delegates participating. The African group of Member States, the European Union and La Comunidad de Estados Latinoamericanos y Caribeños (CELAC) gave statements recognizing ecosystem-based approaches for DRR. UNEP and Wetlands International on behalf of PEDRR partners organized a side briefing on Eco-DRR for delegates. **The First Draft of HFA2 is expected on 21 November**, with additional negotiations of the text scheduled in early December 2014 and January 2015.
