Weather warning system for Nepal farmers

The Government of Nepal is planning to roll out the country's first weather warning system for its farmers, in the hope to stem agricultural losses during the monsoon season. In 2013 alone, an estimated 10,000 hectares were lost to land erosion, flooding and water logging. This weather information system, which will be initially piloted in 4 districts, is expected to be officially rolled out in 2014.


