Turas Project: the Green Living Room



Turas Cities set up a symbolic pilot project in the Stuttgart area, Germany. Compensating for the lack of green spaces in the inner city, this 'green room' in Ludwigsburg is made of cubic walls that contain up to 30 plant species, which help mitigate climate change by absorbing CO2 as well as support adaptation by providing natural cooling. Through regional planning by the Verband Region Stuttgart, green spaces are also preserved in a landscape park and used as protection against flooding.
